Minutes of the Douzaine Meeting held in the Douzaine Room at the Community
Centre on Monday 21st March 2022 at 7.00 pm

Minutes of Meeting held on 21 st February 2022	The minutes were agreed and signed by the Constable.	
Matters Arising / Outstanding	Trees at Les Massies PC advised that the landowners had sent the Constables a copy of their email to Traffic and Highways (T & H) requesting a site meeting to discuss the tree. They had not received a reply so have assumed the matter is closed. We have also not received a reply to the letter we sent.	PC/JG
Planning	It was noted that as discussed at the last meeting a letter has been sent to Environment and Infrastructure highlighting our concerns. A response has not yet been received. SG advised that an objection letter had been sent in respect of a recent planning application whereby a request to build on recently rezoned domestic curtilage had been received.	
Douzaine Council	KF gave an update on the meeting of the sub group of the Douzaine Council which had been formed to discuss Church matters. She reported that discussions had taken place in respect of rectories, glebe land and plurality. It was noted that a policy letter was expected to be put before the States within the next year.	
Parking and Bus stops La Grande Rue	PC reported that a concerned parishioner has raised issues with Traffic and Highways (“T & H”) regarding parking and speeding in La Grande Rue. We in turn have also contacted them to mention the concerns. T & H’s response was to ask the residents affected by the issues to contact them individually with the issues they are experiencing, accompanied by photographs and frequency of the problems. The parishioner who contacted us advised that it was not the responsibility of residents to start taking photos and monitoring flow of traffic as this was the role of T & H.	PC/JG

	It was agreed that a response be sent to T & H advising of the views of the parishioner.
